She is channeling her entrepreneurial spirit and charitable heart to offer the humans and dogs of Louisville a new space to play, drink, run free, and give back. "I love beer and I love dogs," Gina says. She has combined the two — and added a charitable focus on rescue dogs — in her new space that opened in January 2021.

PG&J's provides humans and pups an indoor and outdoor space where dogs can play off-leash. The indoor space has 4,000 square feet of open play area, as well as tables and bar area for the humans. The outdoor space has 8,000 square feet that is fenced and mulched for pups to run and play,
